Jarrett is an ordained minister in the Church Of God In Christ since 2003. He currently attends Greater Mitchell Temple COGIC in Detroit, MI under Bishop John H. Sheard. There he serves as an Associate Minister, and Youth Sunday School Superintendent for that local church: and serves as the Sunday School Superintendent for the Michigan Southwest Jurisdiction that consists of 95 churches, offering mentoring and training programs for youth from 8-22 years old as well as bible study for all ages.

Jarrett also has volunteered for the last 4 years as an AAU (Amateur Athletic Union) for both Common Bond in Ypsilanti, MI and Michigan Warriors in Westland, MI during the spring, summer and fall time. As a coach, he mentors young men ranging from age 10-19 years old, using basketball to teach them life skills, team work and preparing them for college. These young men have the opportunity to go across the country two or three weekends a month to various tournaments exposing them to other cultures and nationalities while showcasing their talents before college scouts.

The scope of the young men we reach come from all walks of life: single parents homes, broken families, under privileged, well-to-do, etc. We touch young men and families from areas like: Wayne, Westland, Canton, Belleville, Romulus, Ypsilanti, Ann Arbor and Detroit. Each season we provide all these players and families a banquet of appreciation and celebration catered by the team moms and coaches.

Production Corner

The Production team at W.F. Whelan Co. consists of the large component repack lines (wheels), the small component repack lines (wheel caps, hose assemblies), and T.P.M.S. assembly lines (wheels.) For those that are not aware, T.P.M.S. is an acronym that stands for “**T**ire **P**ressure **M**onitoring **S**ystem.”

The primary job of the large and small component Production teams is to inspect parts per the customer’s specifications, and to repack onto the customer’s specified dunnage for that part. In the case of T.P.M.S., they’re assembling a band and sensor to each wheel in addition to the inspection and repack process. Over the last 3 months, the Production Repack team has averaged 359,762 wheels per month (or 83,022 wheels per week.) The T.P.M.S. assembly lines have averaged 18,395 wheels per month (or 4,245 wheels per week.)

The Production teams are headed up by 2 Managers and 2 Supervisors, Randy Hicks (Manager) and Janell Downtin (Supervisor) on 1st shift, and Dave Adcock (Manager) and Mike Harding (Supervisor) on 2nd shift. The Supervisors Janell Downtin and Mike Harding, handle the day-to-day operations. While the Managers, Randy Hicks and Dave Adcock handle the more advanced planning activities for the department. We also employ a Production Scheduler, Len Salvador, who assists with the part scheduling for all lines on both shifts as well as handling some miscellaneous administrative duties. We have 5 Line Leads who are responsible for the speed and accuracy of each production run. Our 5 current Line Leads are: Julian Dixon, Evan Stewart, Melissa Heath, Rodney Clark and Rashaad Rutherford. Each Line Lead is responsible for overseeing the productivity and quality of 5 repack workers and 1 bander.
